Increase the safety and social and emotional factors by 3% that influence achievement by the end of the 2022-2023 school year, as measured by the Conditions for Learning survey. Parent/Teacher Conferences will be held based upon the District calendar. Student achievement updates will be provided at Open House, Parent/Teacher Conferences, and Curriculum Events.

The Classroom

Parents will be allowed to observe classrooms with a scheduled appointment with the classroom teacher. Parents will have the opportunity to volunteer based on teacher and student's needs. Student progress will be reported through school/home communication, progress reports, and report cards. Teachers will endeavor to motivate students to learn, make school welcoming and accessible for families. Teachers will provide a safe and caring learning environment.

At Home

- Monitoring attendance (virtual and in person)
- Consistently reviewing school website
- Creating a school work space at home
- Making sure that homework is completed.
- Promoting positive use of scholar's extracurricular time
- Staying informed about my scholar's education and communication with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district
- Participate in parent teacher conferences

Scholars

Students can support their own learning by:

Do homework every day and ask for help when needed.

Read at least 30 minutes every day outside of school time.

Attend and participate in virtual and in person instruction.

Take care of and be responsible for any technology needed to stay fully engaged in virtual instruction.

Give to parents or the adults responsible for scholar welfare all notices and information received from school every day.
