NWEA Testing 1/21-1/24

What is the NWEA?

NWEA is a standardized test that measures a student's academic growth and achievement in math and reading.

The tests are computer adaptive. That means the test will adjust to the student's ability level. The questions that the student answered correctly, the more difficult the questions will get. The same goes if the

students answers incorrectly, the questions will get easier.

Students take the test 3 times a year, in the fall, winter and then spring. This is the second time students will take the test this year.



Report Cards



Report cards will be mailed out the week of January 20th.

It's that time of the school year again. Reports cards for quarter 2 will be distributed by mail this month. Teachers put the final grades in January 13th.

This report card will show Quarter 1 grades, Quarter 2 grades and Semester 1 grades. The columns will say Q1, Q2, and SM1. Semester 1 grades are average of Quarter 1's and Quarter 2's grades.

If your child brings home some grades that are disappointing to you, stay calm. Offer your child reassurance and support.

Find the root cause of the low grades and figure out together how your child can be more accountable for their performance in school. Work together to set reasonable goals to raise the grades.

Encourage them and help them learn from their mistakes. Help them understand what went wrong and encourage them to identify their strengths and weaknesses. Where can they improve. The most important thing to do is work with your child for better outcomes.
