SPECIAL EDUCATION STUDENTS: Our Special Education Office offers a continuum of services and supports designed for children with disabilities, and oversees the provision of appropriate services and supports to all children with special needs and their families in every school.

STUDENTS EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS AND TRANSITIONAL HOUSING: Our Project ACT program provides support services necessary to facilitate the child's success and ongoing participation in the educational system.

NOTE FOR FAMILIES OF NEW NINTH GRADERS: Students who graduate from CMSD high schools are eligible for Say Yes to Education scholarships that pay the full value of tuition, minus federal and state aid, to all public colleges and universities and Pell-eligible training programs in Ohio, and more than 100 private colleges and universities across the country. To qualify, students must be continuously be enrolled in a CMSD high school and live in the District or City of Cleveland from ninth grade through graduation.
